



## ARM Investigations: TAKE ACTION For Horse Allegedly Waterboarded By Trainer

Council Bluffs, IOWA – A horse trainer named Logan Allen, who previously won first place in the 2013 Iowa Horse Fair Colt Starting Challenge, is now under major fire after posting public photos to his Facebook of a horse being waterboarded.

The horse was tied up while on the ground as a garden hose sprayed water all over his body and face. His legs were tied up tightly, and his tongue hung from his mouth. Another group of photos show the horse being sprayed while covered by a large grey tarp .



The photos have ignited a firestorm of rage on social media and have brought about many calls to the sheriff's department in protest.



Logan Allen has since removed the waterboarding photos from his Facebook. However, he has also posted photos of cattle which he allegedly allowed his dogs to attack and mutilate. The results were ripped off ears, tongues, and extensive injuries to the cattle. Logan posted photos of the cattle attack and focused in on the tongue that was on the ground after the attack.



Our partner ARM Investigations, founded by Richard Couto, is working to ensure that alleged horse abusers Logan Carr Allen and Shayanne Allen are held accountable to the full extent for their extreme animal cruelty on horses that Logan “trains”.

ARM has made calls to the Mills County Sheriff’s Department and county attorney offices and will take extensive measures in investigating this matter if necessary. If the sheriff presses charges, the charges will be animal cruelty and waterboarding.

Here is a statement from ARM:

***"It is beyond unacceptable that any living creature be subjected to such forms of inhumane treatment, torture and disregard in which this horse (and other animals) endured. Animals feel the same fear, suffering and pain as any human and society needs to regard any violation of their rights in to the same degree. These criminal acts must be addressed, served and prosecuted to the full extent of the law. Waterboarding, or any degree of animal cruelty, which involves enforcing submission is not to be considered to be any form of 'training' and should be recognized for what it is - extreme animal abuse and torture. This is a case of unimaginable proportions and ARM will see that justice is served."***
